## RESULTS

The partnership will develop the following intellectual outputs within the project:

### **IO1: HateBusters Guide: how to combat hate speech and cyberbullying**

A digital guide will contain information, tools, methods that youth workers and young activists can use in order to first identify and classify hate speech and its different forms in an online and offline level and secondly to build bottom-up youth campaigns that will attract and activate young people against hate.


### **IO2: HateBusters Awareness Toolkit**

This output will be a complete campaign and a guide that has as an aim to combat hate speech both in an online and offline level through the promotion of democracy and the common values of freedom, tolerance and respect of human rights.

### **IO3: HateBusters App!**

It will be a mobile application that will aim to educate both young people and youth workers about real cases of hate speech. The app will include a simulation game in addition to the informational part.

# HATE SPEECH



The HateBusters project was inspired by the No Hate Speech Movement (NHSM) Campaign of the Council of Europe and it uses the “Hate Speech” definition of the NHSM and the Council’s of Europe.

Hate speech, as defined by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe, covers all forms of expression which spread, incite, promote or justify racial hatred, xenophobia, anti-Semitism or other forms of hatred based on intolerance, including intolerance expressed by aggressive nationalism and ethnocentrism, as well as discrimination and hostility against minorities, migrants and people of immigrant origin.
