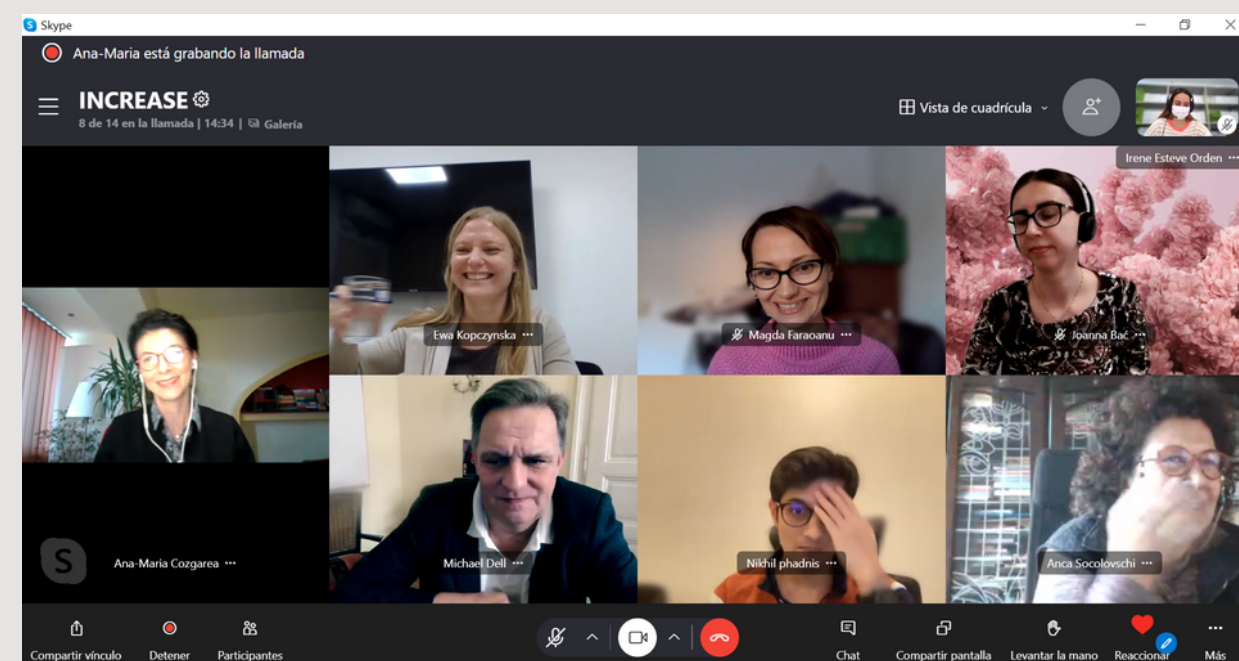

The INCREASE project is coming to an end and the project partners have met during the last three months to organise the last tasks to be carried out in the project and to improve the results.

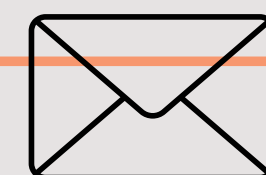
The platform materials are now available in all languages of the consortium: English, Finnish, German, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian and Spanish.
