### AMOR Project Transnational Meeting in Bilbao

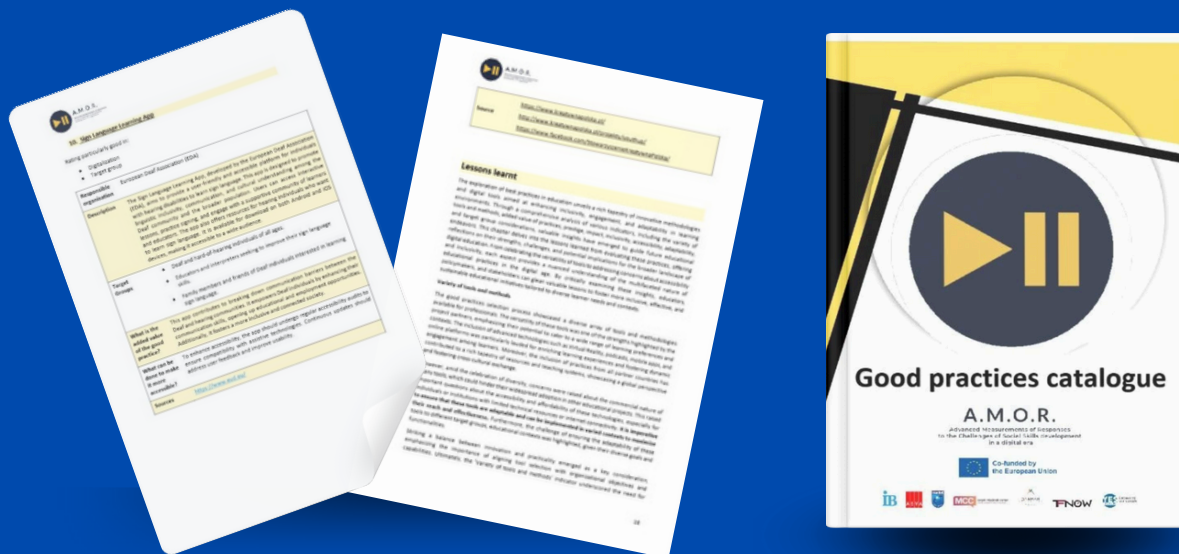
The transnational partners meeting in Bilbao brought together representatives of the AMOR project to assess progress, share experiences, and plan upcoming activities. Hosted at Calasanz, the two-day event, held on 26–27 November 2024, began with comprehensive presentations on project management, dissemination strategies, financial procedures, and quality and risk assurance. Partners from YES-Forum, AEVA, and other organizations presented updates on key project results, including the AMOR Good Practice Catalogue and the Digital Handbook, which focus on inclusive, intercultural activities and practical educational toolkits.

The meeting was enriched by insightful visits that grounded the project's aims in real-world experiences. Participants visited Calasanz School and met with the representatives of the Down Syndrome Foundation—each offering valuable perspectives on inclusion and support in educational and workplace environments. These visits deepened partners' understanding of the challenges and successes in inclusive practice.

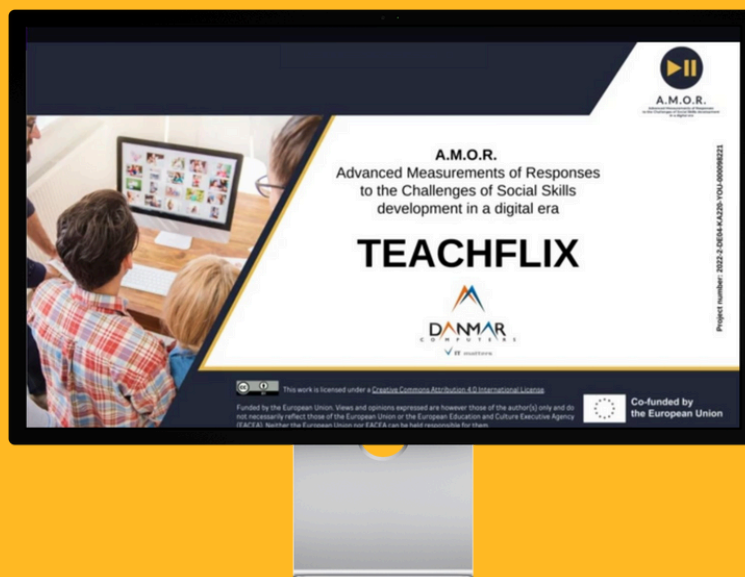
## Explore our AMOR Video Tutorials – Now on YouTube!
